  - Presentation by Dr. Tammaru see District 89 website for presentation information
  - Primary feedback that caused board to pause was take more time to study information and AV school was going to have over a 50% change to one schools population with the initial proposed changes.
  - Kids are missing instructional time due to administrative transfers. This was a huge concern for administrators.
  - The committee will reconvene to look at the question is it possible to grandfather any student in across all grades k-5.
  - Dr. Tammaru thanked the committee for their hard work and dedication
